# The Republican "War on Women": A Clear and Present Danger

When you are considering how to talk with (or write to) your friends and neighbors in the next few days before the June 5<sup>th</sup> election, because you MUST do this if you do NOT want Wisconsin to become WISSISSIPPI, please think about the bumper sticker: Why Would A

Woman Vote Republican? (available from the
DPDC office for a donation). The Old Party may
once have been Grand (say, in its support for the
abolition of slavery), but now it is directed by a
network of "ol' boys" who have reverted to some
very old (and rancid) ideas about women and girls.

Oh yes, there are some "ol' girls" as well who have swallowed the not-so-funny pill of prejudice against other women or the fantasy pill that transforms a fertilized cell into a full-fledged human being with rights to life its mother doesn't have.

If your friends and neighbors still have any girls or women in their families, they should be invited to think concretely about the possible effects of Republican legislation on the lives of those human beings.

Do they really want a Governor who would deny women the right to sue an employer who has denied them equal pay for equal work?

Do they really want a Governor who champions the idea of life in the form of a fetus over the fully human life of a mother or the health and well-being of children who are already born?

One who sponsors legislation that favors "preaching abstinence" in public schools over teaching the latest scientific information about human reproduction and contraception?

One who would gladly deprive women and girls access to the highly respected services of Planned Parenthood?

One who would limit access to contraception?

One who would legislate what images must be shown to a girl or woman before she decides whether or not to continue a pregnancy, no matter what the psychological, social or medical reasons for the decision are?

One who would require parents to be involved even in cases where parental abuse and incest are involved?

One who would gut the protections provided by prior legislation on violence against women?

These are not hypothetical actions against women. They are either signed into law as of the last WI legislative session or "in the pipeline." They are signs of a fundamental disrespect for the ability of girls and women to make good decisions about their bodies (without religious indoctrination administered by the state).

They signal to the world that women are not equal with men in the eyes of Wisconsin law under a Republican administration!

Shall I trouble you with statistics? Women are now more than half of our population. Women head more than half of the single-family households. More than half of American women work outside the home --because we must.

When we are forced to have more children than we can support with adequate food, shelter, education and health care, the whole society is at risk. When we are denied equality, the value of equality itself is endangered.

When Republicans choose to ignore these facts in favor of fantasies about women's "proper" role or a belief in our innate inferiority, they threaten not only the well being of half of the population but our entire way of life.

These Republican policies and laws signal a fundamental disrespect for doctors and teachers who are now subject to regulation by officials without professional qualifications.

They signal a fundamental disrespect for the American democratic principle of separation of church and state, since the impetus for such legislation originally came from the Pope through his politically powerful Bishops on the one hand and from fundamentalist (fanatical, literalist) religious groups on the other.

We have also seen that Walker is not content to control the legislature as if he were its prime minister; he has assumed control of many offices and functions (such as the parole system) and clearly plans to take over the pension system for his own purposes.

What Walker has done to women in Wisconsin, to teachers, doctors, other government officials, and even to members of his own party who did not agree with his policies, he would do to anyone. While he says he believes in individual freedom and the power of the people, he acts against those beliefs.

# Not Registered to Vote? Register on Election Day at the Polls

Yes, you can register to vote at your polling place on election day. At this time, **PHOTO ID IS NOT REQUIRED.** 

You will fill out a form (GAB 131), and will need to provide a driver's license number, or the last four digits of your social security number. You will also need to provide proof of your residence address. A variety of documents will serve this purpose:

- A current and valid WI Driver License or ID Card
- Any other official identification card or license issued by a Wisconsin governmental body or unit
- An employee ID card, but not a business card
- A real property tax bill or receipt for the current year or the year preceding the date of the election
- A residential lease
- A picture ID from a university, college or technical college coupled with a fee receipt or an oncampus housing listing provided by the university, college or technical college to the municipality that denotes US Citizenship
- A utility bill for the period commencing not earlier than 90 days before the day registration is made
- A bank statement
- A paycheck
- A check or other document issued by a unit of government

If you have moved since May 9, 2012, you should vote at the polling place for your **old** address.
